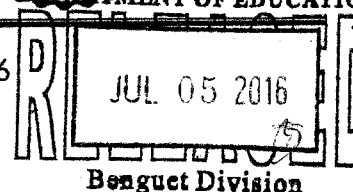

Concerned Public Elementary and Secondary School Heads

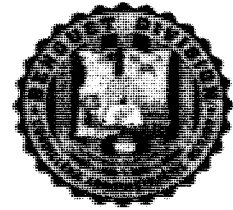
