- 1. Pursuant to Executive Order No. 137, s. 1999 re, Observance of the National Disaster Consciousness Month (NDCM) during the month of July every year, and Executive Order No. 29, 2017 renaming NDCM to National Disaster Resilience Month, the Schools Division Office, through its Disaster Risk Reduction and Management, have lined up division level activities and suggested school and district activities that are to be conducted for the whole month of July.

MECHANICS ON THE POSTER MAKING AND ESSAY WRITING CONTESTS

- To minimize disruption of classes and travel of participants and coaches, THE DIVISION LEVEL CONTEST WILL NOT BE 'ON-THE-SPOT'. However, it is highly encouraged that the district and school level contests will strictly follow the allotted time because the REGIONAL LEVEL CONTEST will be ON THE SPOT.
- 2. The general theme for the contest is, **KAHANDAAN SA SAKUNA'T PELIGRO PARA SA TUNAY NA PAGBABAGO"**
- 3. The contest is open to students in the public and private elementary, junior and senior high schools as follows:
 - a. Poster making contests will be for elementary pupils (Grades 1-6)
 - b. Essay Writing contest will be for junior and senior high school students (Grades 7-12)
- 4. The specific theme for the contests will be on the role of the youth in connection with the general theme. District level winners will represent their district for the division level contest. Hence, it is highly encouraged that a District level contest be done to choose the best entry for the Division Level Contest.
- 5. Winners in the Poster and Essay Writing Contest shall be awarded cash prizes as follows:

First Place – Php1,000.00 Second Place – Php 800.00 Third Place – Php 500.00

- 6. Coaches of the Participants shall receive a Certificate of Recognition signed by the Schools Division Superintendent. All other contestants and coaches will be considered as Division Finalists will be given Certificates of Recognition as well.
- 7. All district entries should be submitted on or before July 18, 2019 at 5:00PM. Official judging of the entries will be conducted on July 19, 2019 at Adivay Hall, Wangal, La Trinidad, Benguet.
- 8. Guidelines are as follows:

I. POSTER MAKING CONTEST GUIDELINES

- a) The artwork shall follow a PORTRAIT orientation, 20 x 30 illustration board. The name of the participant, school and district shall be pasted at the back of the illustration board. No text or mark identifying the participant should appear on the artwork.
- b) Although the contest at the division level is **not on-the-spot**, **m**ake sure that the artwork has been made within two (2) hours only.
- c) Entries will be judged on the following criteria:

Overall presentation (creativity, harmony, color, impact, etc) - 50%
Relevance to the theme - 40%
Originality - 10%
TOTAL 100%

IL ESSAY WRITING CONTEST GUIDELINES

- a) Laptops should have been utilized during the district level contest. Make sure that internet access will not be used during the duration of the contest.
- b) Works must be in English and must follow the following specifications:

Paper size - A4
Font Style - Arial
Font Size - 12
Alignment - justified
Margin - 1" on all sides

Spacing - 1" on all sides

- Double Space

Maximum word count - 750

- c) The essay piece should have been made within two (2) hours with no inputs or interference from the coach.
- d) The electronic copy of the district winning piece should be sent via email at nerissa.barbosa@deped.gov.ph using the subject line, NDRM 2019 ESSAY WRITING CONTEST, <NAME OF DISTRICT>, <NAME OF SCHOOL>, <NAME OF CONTESTANT>, <NAME OF COACH>.
- e) Entries will be judged on the following criteria:

Substance and Content - 40%
Relevance to the theme - 30%
Originality - 15%
Mastery of the English Language
TOTAL 100%

Awarding of winners will be conducted during the NDRM Culminating Program in a date to be announced in a separate memorandum,

 - School heads shall organize a special meeting with parents to discuss this homework for maximum participation.
- II. Processing of Responses to the Family Earthquake Preparedness Questionnaire
 - Upon submission of the questionnaire, the adviser shall discuss with the students their family's responses; and
 - Then, all advisers shall tabulate and summarize the answers on the family assessment question only.






