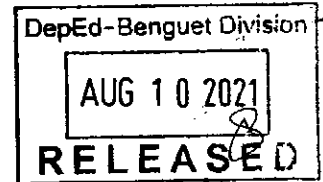

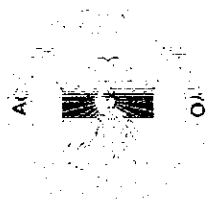

**Subject: SUBMISSION OF LIST OF DEPED REPRESENTATIVES TO
THE REGIONAL/LOCAL ELCAC CLUSTERS**

Executive Order 70, s. 2018 created the National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (NTF-ELCAC) and was established to synchronize the movement of the government to end the five-decade long atrocities and abuses committed by the Communist Party of the Philippines/New People's Army (CPP/NPA). The Department of Education, as one of the member agencies of the NTF-ELCAC, regularly participates in the meetings called for by the task force.

In line with the Department's role as a member agency of the NTF-ELCAC, the Office of the Undersecretary for Administration (OUA) requests the concerned officials to submit the list of their ELCAC representatives from their respective offices to the NTF-ELCAC regional/local clusters.

The NTF-ELCAC consists of 12 National Clusters/Lines of Effort (LOE) to ensure the alignment of the goals and objectives set in the NTF-ELCAC National Plan. Each Cluster shall have its own context analysis, strategic interventions, and oversight functions as reflected in their respective implementation plans, and are maintained down to the regional/local levels.

DepEd is a member of the following clusters:

1. Basic Services;
2. Sectoral Unification, Capacity Building and Empowerment (SUCBEM);
3. E-CLIP and Amnesty Program;
4. Localized and Peace Engagement; and
5. Poverty Reduction, Livelihood, and Employment.
