

- 1. The Schools Division of Benguet recognizes the contribution of the Boy Scout of the Philippines in forming the learners of Benguet through leadership training and other programs, projects, and activities. - 5. Unit leaders concerned must keep track records of respective active scouts and to assist in the Advancement Scheme for rank promotion and to earn their Merit Badges based on the different activities undertaken.
- Sponsoring Institutions/ individual adult leaders may participate in any of the scouting activities provided that Adult Leaders assisting shall properly delegate official task assignment at the school/ district level including preparation of complete travel documents;
- 7. Calendar of Activities and training schedules for SY 2023 -2024 are provided to enable the early preparations for effective and efficient participation to scouting activities. Refer to Annex "A" & "B" for the details of the Program and activities.

 We are pleased to announce the holding of the 17th National Scout Jamboree on December 11- 17, 2023 at Passi City, Province of Itoilo, with the Theme: "Youth Engagement: Sustaining Relevance and strengthening Resilience".

- 2. Aims and objectives: Promote the highest quality of scouting, one that is faithful to the mission, principles and method of scouting and adapted to the needs and aspirations of young people;
- 4. Activities focused on the following:
 - 4.1. Community service project related to the current thrusts of the World Scouting (Environment Education, Peace Education and Development Education);
 - 4.2. Undergo projects, programs and activities that will cater to the fulfillment of the requirements of selected Merit badges and scout ranks under the Advancement Scheme;
 - 4.3. Develop core life skills and 21st century leadership capabilities through team building, cooperative learning, group dynamics, creative problem solving and decision-making skills:
 - 4.4. Keep one abreast with the prevailing issued about the environment, human rights, health, education, culture and science and technology through the Global Development Village, City of science and Cross roads of cultures among others.
- 5. Qualification for Participation. The following are the qualifications for all participating Scouts and Adult Leaders
 - A. Boy Scout and Senior Scout
 - 5.1. Must be currently registered boy or Senior Scout,
 - 5.2. 9 to 12 years old for boy Scout and 13 to 18 years old for Senior Scouts;
 - 5.3. Scout is expected to have leadership potentials;
 - 5.4. Must have sufficient camping experience;
 - 5.5. Must be at least a holder of Advancement rank;
 - 5.6. Must be equipped with camping gears;
 - 5.7. MUST BE A TEAM PLAYER;
 - 5.8. Physically fit to undergo strenuous activities as certified by a physician;
 - 5.9. Must submit a waiver signed by Parent's/ guardian consent;

B. ADULT LEADER/S ATTENDING

- 5.10 Must be currently registered as a Unit Leader,
- 5.11 Trained as a Troop Leader / Outfit Advisor and had been handling a unit for at least 2 years;
- 5.12 Must possess leadership skills;
- 5.13 Must have sufficient experience in camp management and handling the scouts;
- 5.14 Must be equipped with camping gears;
- 5.15 MUST BE A TEAM PLAYER AND WILLING TO BE ASSIGNED IN THE CAMP AS PROGRAM OR ADMINISTRATION COORDINATOR;
- 5.16 Physically fit to undergo strenuous activities;
- 5.17 Must have cleared from any school responsibilities approved by proper authorities;
- 5.18 Willing to process official travel documents of participant/s attending representing their respective schools;
- All concerned are hereby enjoined to promote and help ensure the maximum participation of Scouts and adult leaders;
- Sponsoring Institutions through the Unit leaders shall strictly comply with the guidelines and requirements hereto attached for reference as Annex "A" and "B";
- 8. Other details of the activity shall be issued from time to time in order to provide everyone with the latest information and details of the Jamboree, allowing all participants to adequately prepare for the event.

19 NELR VENTURE CAMP GUIDELINES

- 1. ARRIVALS: Participants must be at the venue on November 9, 2023 for the grand opening ceremony and to leave the camp on November 12, 2023.
- 2. **EQUIPMENT AND FOOD PROVISION**: The Council will have a common mess, cooking pots and other kitchen utensils/ needs will be provided except eating utensils scouts must provide their own
- TENTAGE & OTHER CAMPING GEARS Participants must bring their own bolo, tents and other camping needs
- 4. **EXPECTED TIME OF DEPARTURE**: November 9, 2023, La Trinidad Bauko, Mt. Próvince, 400 o'clock in the morning

Participants from Northern Benguet may arrange their own transportation requirements (negotiable)

S. REGISTRATION FEE DETAILS

The registration fee is not refundable but transferable. Sponsoring institutions will be responsible to replace participants in case registered participants will withdraw;
