

SUBJECT: IDENTIFIED PARTICIPANTS TO THE CREATION OF INTEGRATIVE ASSESSMENTS WEBINAR

- 1. The Schools Division of Benguet in partnership with Berkley School Incorporated will be conducting a three-day webinar on October 25 to 27, 2021 re Creation of Integrative Assessments (Enclosure 1) which basically aims to:
 - a. Provide school heads, master teachers, subject teachers, and district supervisors with the proper foundation to be able to begin a practice of integration in the different subject areas especially in terms of assessments; and
 - b. Engage the participants in the creation of integrative assessment through a workshop using their current context, their prior knowledge, technical assistance from trainers, and the experience of teachers from Berkeley.
- 2. Identified school participants (Enclosure 2) shall serve as pilot schools in the implementation of this program and will be in close coordination with Berkley School Inc. during the preparation, implementation, and concluding of activities.
- 3. Identified participants shall take note of the following prior to the conduct of the activity:

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TRAINING PROPOSAL Creation of Integrative Assessments with SDO Benguet

Rationale:

The pandemic greatly changed learning delivery in schools. The challenge of ensuring covering the Most Essential Learning Competencies continues to persist as we open another school year. The Department of Education through its Curriculum Bureau emphasized academic ease as a response to these issues experienced by teachers in OUCI - 2020 307. Integration was suggested as a measure to foster academic ease especially in activities done weekly in formative or summative assessments.

Program Objectives:

- 1. Provide school heads, master teachers, subject teachers, and district supervisors with the proper foundation to be able to begin a practice of integration in the different subject areas especially in terms of assessments.
- 2. Engage the participants in the creation of integrative assessment through a workshop using their current context, their prior knowledge, technical assistance from trainers, and the experience of teachers from Berkeley.

TRAINING AUDIENCE

We are looking at PILOT SCHOOLS ideally with 10 participants per school composed of the:

- 1. School Heads
- 2. Master Teachers
- 3. Subject Teachers

They must have broad and deep Content and Pedagogical Knowledge. Ideally, participants are subject matter experts. Each subject must be represented well in the group. Openness, Creativity, and Collaboration is key in terms of the mindset of participants

TRAINING FRAMEWORK

- Grounding: This training will begin where the participants are and with what they have. As a team, they will form an instructional vision. Before forming their school vision for SY 2021-2022, participants should be able to:
 - a. Establish the current state of the Philippine curriculum and identify the gaps by reviewing the ACTRC K to 12 Curriculum Study;
 - b. Review the LCOP, SIP, Curriculum Documents, and Lesson Plans; and
 - c. Evaluate the learning modalities used and strategies employed.
