

DEVELOPMENT OF MULTILINGUAL STORY BOOKS AS LITERACY REMEDIAL TOOL AND BRIDGING TOOL

- Reading and learning materials were cited by Malone (2013) as among the essential
 components of Mother Tongue-Based Multilingual Education (MTB-MLE) in order
 for learners to become multiliterate, multilingual and multicultural. Consequently, to
 facilitate the development of literacy in the mother tongue and second language
 (Filipino and English) among learners, the K to 12 Curriculum enjoins schools to
 contextualize the curriculum.
- 2. The Department of Education issued DO No. 21, s. 2019 to guide schools in the implementation of the K to 12 Curriculum, including the MTB-MLE Program, by outlining the roles of each governance level and its personnel to further strengthen the processes, standards and tools used for contextualization of teaching and learning materials in the mother tongue. Said order supports DO No. 32, s. 2015 which provides examples of localization and indigenization of the curriculum that includes translating a story in the Teacher's Guide to the language of the locality, translating popular stories to the local language, and using stories of the community as a springboard to teach the competencies in the language subjects.
- 3. To further realize the implementation of these in the Division of Benguet, there will be a development of multilingual story books to contain the local stories in the different Benguet mother tongues with its Filipino and English versions. These multilingual story books will be utilized as literacy remedial tool for struggling readers and as bridging tools for Grades 2 and 3. Said endeavor will include the



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selection of the best stories from locally developed big books and small books; translation of these stories in other mother tongues, Filipino and English; lay-outing and design; quality assurance and piloting of the multilingual story books.
