

#### SCHEDULE OF ACTIVITIES FOR THE NATIONAL LEARNING CAMP

1. As a result of the Regional Planning for the 2025 National Learning Camp (NLC) on February 19-20, the Schools Division of Benguet through the Curriculum Implementation Division will observe the conduct the following activities:

2. This will serve as a guide to schools as they prepare for their 2025 NLC and EOSY activities proposal. Schools are advised to ensure that their submissions include the following components: a. Approval Sheet (include the district head, ESM supervisors, CID Chief and SDS), b. Detailed

Activity Proposal for both NLC and EOSY Activities, c. List of NLC and EOSY Campers, d. Parental Consent, e. List of LCVs and f. Expression of Intent to Serve as LCV.

- 3. Only learners identified as needing intervention or having failing grades in English, Science and Mathematics shall be encouraged to participate in the NLC, while learners classified as conditionally promoted shall be required to attend the EOSY activities focusing on learning areas other than English, Science, and Mathematics.
- 4. A learner-teacher ratio of at most 10:1 shall be maintained during the learning camp sessions. Teachers serving in the Learning Camp Volunteer (LCV) program and EOSY activities shall receive a meal allowance of Php 250 and One (1) day service credit per actual day of service for the duration of the three-week period.
- 5. Mechanics and criteria for judging the NLC and EOSY Activity Posters can be found in the attached enclosure.
- 6. Expenses for internet connectivity and other necessary costs related to the implementation of these activities like reproduction of learning resources may be charged to the school's MOOE and/or other local funds, subject to existing budgeting, accounting, and auditing rules and regulations.

7. Immediate dissemination of and strict compliance with this memorandum is directed.

## Mechanics and Criteria for Judging the NLC and EOSY Activity Posters

#### Mechanics:

- a. Posters must be original creations of the learners. Only one learner-artist per entry is allowed.
- b. The contest is open to all public-school learners, specifically:
  - Secondary (Junior High School) learners for the Digital Poster Contest
  - Elementary learners for the Manual Poster Contest
- c. Poster Size Requirements:
  - Manual Poster (Elementary): 1/2 Illustration Board (15 inches x 22 inches)
  - Digital Poster (Secondary): 1080 pixels x 1920 pixels, in JPEG or PNG format, with a minimum resolution of 300 dpi.
- d. Any medium may be used for manual posters (e.g., paint, watercolor, crayons, colored pencils, oil pastels, etc.) while digital posters may be created using any design software (e.g., Canva, Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator, etc.).
- e. Each district shall submit one (1) digital poster entry (for secondary) and one (1) manual poster entry (for elementary). All entries must be submitted on or before April 11, 2025.
- f. Certificates and prizes shall be awarded to the Top 3 Winners for each category (Manual and Digital Poster Contest).
- g. The Schools Division of Benguet reserves the right to use, publish, and reproduce all winning entries for advocacy and promotion of the NLC and EOSY activities.

## A. Criteria for Digital Poster Contest (Secondary- Junior High)

Criteria	Description	Percentage			
Relevance to the Theme	The poster effectively conveys the message and advocacy of NLC and EOSYA, aligned with the purpose and significance to learners' recovery and support.				
Creativity and Originality	The poster demonstrates creative, and original design concepts  — avoiding stock templates and ensuring innovative use of digital design tools.	25%			
Technical Excellence	Effective use of design software tools, balance of elements, image resolution, text readability, and quality of graphic composition.	20%			
Visual Impact	The overall design is eye-catching, visually appealing, and can attract attention when displayed on digital platforms.	15%			
Clarity and Simplicity of Message	The intended message is clear and understandable at first glance, effectively communicating the purpose of the activity.	10%			

# B. Criteria for Manual Poster Contest (Elementary)

Criteria	Description	Percentage
Relevance to the Theme	The poster clearly reflects the message and advocacy of NLC and EOSYA, showing learners' understanding of the theme.	30%
Creativity and Originality	Shows imaginative and unique artistic expression, using freehand drawing techniques and creative concepts directly from the learners.	25%
Artistic Quality & Mastery	Proper use of colors, neatness, attention to detail, and mastery of art materials such as crayons, colored pencils, watercolor, etc.	
Visual Appeal	Overall composition is attractive, colorful, and stands out when displayed.	15%
Clarity and Simplicity of Message	The message is easily understood, clear, and related to the advocacy being promoted.	10%
